A friend, fellow fisherman and artist introduced me to this style of art as a means of preserving the record of a fish and accurately share the wonders of the beautiful world below with those around you. Some of my fondest memories both here and abroad, have been with family and friends around a fire enjoying the fresh catch of the day cooked the “local way.” I only create prints from specimen that will be eaten or have been foraged off the shoreline with the aim of bringing life to another beautiful piece. Most of my prints are printed with sumi ink on handmade shoji or washi paper. Having recently teamed up with Julian here at Halocline to source the reclaimed wood and construction of the frames, the art is brought to a deeper level of awe and beauty.

As a fisherman and waterman, I have a deep respect for the ocean and all the inhabitants within. I aim to capture images that reflect the sheer size and, sometimes eerie, but always fascinating creatures found beneath the waves.

I have a selection of original prints that are either complete and ready to ship or in the process of completion. I am also well connected with seafood wholesalers/importers and commercial fishing captains and divers so if there were something you would like for me to create, simply inquire and I will do my best to cater to your request. I can also print a catch that may be special for you and your family. All prints that are shown here are originals; but if you see something you like that is unavailable, I do have reproduction prints of select pieces.
